From the 23rd to the 27th of January, we had the opportunity to participate in one of the biggest MUNs in the world, HMUN, taking place in Boston. We were able to represent Tunisia during this very impressive experience. Some of us represented Morocco within the General Assembly, dispatched in several different committees, and some were in the Specialized Agencies, where they were only 15 delegates. We spent from 4 to 8 hours debating with up to 200 people from all over the world all representing different countries.

During the trip and stay in Boston, all the HMUNers really bonded, and I would consider this experience as one of the best I have ever lived, and even though we had to work really hard it was really interesting to know more about the different topics that our chairs had come up with.

We actually started working on these subjects at the beginning of the year, as soon as we entered the group. It took a lot of hard work and determination. The club met every Wednesday afternoon to continue and keep up our work and research. The work that had to be done included the hunt for sponsors that would agree to give us some financial aid to make the trip possible, the administrative paperwork, and everything that makes you stress before and during a trip.

This once in a lifetime experience has taught me to learn a bit more about the world around us, and if you want to join the club, remember that your English doesn't have to be perfect, neither does your knowledge of the current geopolitical events and issues, or of the MUN rules. You can learn by practicing and getting involved as much as possible, with motivation and dedication.
